The Association assumes no liability for personal injury or for loss or damage to any property of the exhibitors, concessionaires, or patrons due to theft, fire, vandalism, weather conditions, or other causes.

**Fair Office:** The Fair Office will open on Monday, September 23 and will remain open until Monday, September 30. Hours fair week are Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., Sunday 2 to 5 p.m., and Monday 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. The Fair Office phone number is (717) 733-4451, ext. 1000. This number is available year round through voice mail. You may also email us at fair@ephratafair.org.

Handicapped Parking and Comfort Facilities: Handicapped parking is available in the West Franklin Street parking lot, Lake Street (except parade night), Borough Hall with entrance from Fulton Street, and the Ephrata National Bank off of Locust Street (after banking hours). Parking fees will be charged. All handicap locations that we arrange are within the perimeter of the Wednesday night parade, so any parking therein will have restricted exit until the parade is finished. Portable toilets will be located at various locations convenient to the midway and Tent City. A handicapped portable toilet will be located on the south side of the Fair building on South State Street.

**Tent City:** Tent City in the Grater Memorial Park features agricultural and commercial exhibits Tuesday through Friday evening. These exhibits include livestock, grain, vegetables, and numerous contests. Delicious food is available at the various refreshment stands.

**Shuttle Bus:** For the convenience of the public, on **Tuesday**, **Thursday**, and **Friday** from 4 p.m. until 10 p.m., a **free** shuttle bus will be provided from uptown at the corner of South State Street and West Franklin Street to Tent City. The pickup spot at Tent City will be the corner of Vine and King Streets by the swimming pool. On **Wednesday**, the bus will run from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. In addition to the regular stops, the bus will stop at Cornerstone Mennonite Church on Oak Street. 





### **NO PETS PERMITTED ON THE MIDWAY**

Ephrata Borough has an ordinance prohibiting animals on the midway or at Tent City during the Ephrata Fair. No person shall have an animal on the midway, including the Railroad Station parking lot, of the Ephrata Fair from 7 A.M. Tuesday until 12 midnight Saturday. This ordinance does not apply to dogs which assist the handicapped. Any person found guilty of violating this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$600.00.



Wednesday Evening, Week of Fair

Parade starts at 7:00 p.m. All participants should arrive at the staging area by 5:30 p.m.

Route of Parade: The parade begins at the Ephrata High School on Oak Boulevard towards Fulton Street, then proceeds west on Fulton Street, east on Main Street, north on Park Avenue, east on Chestnut Street, south on Church Avenue, east on Locust Street, south on Lincoln Avenue, west on Main Street, south on Lake Street, west on Fulton Street, south on State Street to Queen Street where the parade disbands. Many trucks prefer to continue on State Street out of town rather than turn onto Queen Street which is quite congested.

# THANK YOU TO ALL PARADE VOLUNTEERS!

### **Parking and Traffic**

**Spectators and Residents:** Street parking is not allowed along the parade route. Parking can be obtained in parking lots and streets surrounding the perimeter of the parade route. Early arrival is encouraged.

The streets along the parade route will be completely closed prior to the parade with no through traffic allowed until the parade concludes.

### Reserve Your Spot!

Chairs may be put out along the parade route after 12:00 p.m. on the Sunday prior to the parade. Chairs placed along the route prior to this time are subject to removal.



### **Parade Regulations**

- 1. All parade entries must be pre-approved by the parade committee. Entries will not be allowed after September 2, 2024 or after parade capacity has been reached. We encourage interested parties to register early to ensure space availability.
- The parade is a continuous moving event with no pausing at any of the judging areas on the parade route.
- 3. Handouts are permitted. However, for the safety of small children, **THROWING FROM VEHICLES IS NOT PERMITTED!** Food and candy must be in their original wrappers.
- 4. No alcoholic beverages are permitted.
- 5. The Parade Committee and the Fair Association may refuse any organization. Decision of the Parade Committee is final.
- 6. All participants driving in the parade must have a valid driver's license and vehicle insurance.
- 7. All animals in the parade must be under control and immediately cleaned up after.
- 8. Street parking is not permitted in the staging area on Oak Blvd. or on Old Mill Road between Oak and S. State Street. Parade participants may be dropped off on Old Mill Road between Oak Blvd. and State Route 272. However, vehicles may not park there.





# Start Here:

There are many contests available for all ages at the Ephrata Fair. First time exhibitors are always welcome and encouraged to ask questions! Some contests are divided into age groups for a level playing field.

The Ephrata Fair features a variety of contests for items ranging from critters, crafts, cupcakes and everything in between! You can view the full directory of contests and their rules in this premium book. The chairpeople that oversee the various contests are listed as well, so you can easily contact them if you have questions.

Exhibit drop off locations will vary depending on the type of item. Baked goods, photography, and models should be dropped off at the Ephrata Fair Office. Plants, crafts and artwork go to the Pioneer Fire Hall. Needlework items are received at the Ephrata Borough Hall. Animals, vegetables and grains are located in Grater Memorial Park. A detailed list of locations is available on the "Maps" page at ephratafair.org and inside the premium book.

Exhibits located in the Fair Office, Fire Hall and Borough Hall are received from 3pm-8pm on Monday, September 23 and can be picked up on Sunday, September 29. Exhibits located in Grater Memorial Park are received from 4pm-8pm on Monday, September 23 and removed on Saturday, September 28 from 8am-10am.

Entries are categorized into a Department, Section and Class. For example, if you were to enter your famous chocolate chip cookies, you would be competing in Department 15 (Home & Dairy Products), Section 101 (Baked Goods), Class 13002 (Chocolate Chip). Your entry would compete against others in the same class.

For the best experience when bringing exhibits to the Fair, we recommend pre-registering your entries online at ephratafair.org. Alternatively, you may complete the entry form on the next page and mail it in. Fair volunteers will be on-site during drop-off to assist with receiving and classifying items.

### **GENERAL RULES FOR EXHIBITS**

- 1. All exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Ephrata Fair.
- 2. The Fair management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations as its judgments may determine.
- 3. Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from all injury and damage, but the Ephrata Farmers' Day Association is not, in any way, to be held responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.
- 4. All entries must be grown, produced or made since last year's Fair by the person whose name appears on the entry tag. Only entries by exhibitors from Lancaster County and its contiguous counties will be accepted. Exhibitors in Department 11 must be under nineteen years of age. Ephrata Fair will collect a \$2.00 fee per head for all livestock entries.
- 5. Only one exhibit per class per exhibitor is permitted, except in some livestock classes. Any exhibit can only be entered in one class.
- 6. An exhibit on display cannot be removed before designated removal times or forfeiture of premium will result.
- 7. Chairpersons of department reserve the right of refusing to accept any entry unfit to show. Chairpersons may limit the number of entries per exhibitor. No nudity or semi-nudity will be accepted.
- 8. When there is no competition in a class, the judges shall award the premium on the merits of the individual exhibit. Same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered.
- 9. Should any individual enter any article in any other name than that of the bona fide owner, the person making such entry shall be disqualified from the competition.
- 10. The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases, except where mistakes, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases, the General Chairman may make the decision. The case may be appealed to the Fair Management, whose decision is final. All protests regarding the judging or premium money must be filed in writing at the Fair Office within 48 hours of the conclusion of the Fair.
- 11. During the judging, buildings are to be closed to everyone except fair officials, judges and necessary attendants.
- 12. It shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor to properly name the entry/exhibit or breed of livestock he/she is entering. Any exhibit improperly entered will be disqualified to receive a premium, but the judges may make the correction on the entry tag for the exhibitor's benefit.
- 13. Any exhibitor displaying unsportsmanlike conduct toward judges, show officials, exhibitors, or general public will forfeit earned prize money and will be banned from exhibiting the following year.
- 14. Premium checks will be issued to winners of uptown exhibits at the Fair Office on Sunday from 2-4 p.m., and Monday following the fair from 10 a.m.-8 p.m. Premium checks for winners at Tent City will be available on Saturday 8 a.m.-10 a.m. at Grater Park, and then follow the uptown Fair Office schedule. All checks not cashed in 60 days will be void and considered a donation to the Ephrata Farmers' Day Association. **Premium checks will be mailed if a self-addressed stamped envelope is delivered to the Fair Office by Saturday noon week of the Fair.**
- 15. Uptown exhibited items which are not picked up within 14 days following the fair closing date will be discarded at the discretion of the department chairman. Tent City exhibited items must be picked up by Saturday at 10 a.m.
- 16. The Fair management is not responsible for any errors in printing.

### **ENTERING PROCEDURE FOR EXHIBITORS**

Each exhibitor must secure a number before entering an exhibit. This number will be used for <u>all entries</u> at the fair, Uptown or Tent City. Numbers will be issued at exhibit registration areas. Each exhibitor entering 5 or more items may pre-enter by mailing the General Entry Form. Pre-entered uptown exhibitors should pick up exhibitor number and completed exhibit tags at Fair Office (front door) **before entering exhibits.** Pre-entered Tent City exhibitors should pick up completed exhibit tags at Vegetable Tent. NO blank tags given to exhibitors. This procedure will speed up the entry process.



- 1. Eligibility: Sale lamb exhibitors will be limited to any FFA or 4-H member who resides in the following school districts: Ephrata, Cocalico, Eastern Lancaster County, Conestoga Valley, and Warwick. Non-sale lamb exhibitors are limited to Lancaster County FFA or 4-H members.
- Ownership: The lambs must have been on feed at least 45 days before the Fair starting date.
   ENTRY MUST BE SHOWN BY THE OWNER except when the owner has more than one entry per class.
- 3. Showing: All breeds shown together. Lambs may be ewes or wethers; NO RAMS, NO TAILS.
- 4. Entries: Exhibitors are limited to 3 animals. All entries must be mailed to the chairman by September 13th. Entry fees must accompany entry form. If only one animal is entered per class, it will be judged on its merits.
- 5. Bedding and Feeding: Bedding will be furnished by the Ephrata Farmers' Day Association. The feed, feed boxes and water buckets must be furnished by the exhibitor who must see that animals are fed and cared for during the ENTIRE fair. The Ephrata Farmers' Day Association will provide a night watchman to stay with the animals.
- 6. Health:
  - A. No sheep showing clinical signs of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease including foot rot, sore mouth or pink eye will be admitted to any show.
  - B. All sheep must bear an official USDA/APHIS eartag to be exhibited.
  - C. The flock of origin, including sheep consigned to a show, shall be examined by an accredited veterinarian. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1 is required at weigh-in and must state that he examined the entire flock and found no evidence of contagious, infectious, or external parasitic disease. Certification by owner and an accredited vet concerning exposure to scrapies must also appear.
- 7. Sale: All sale animals must be marked with an ear tag prior to check-in. Lambs must weigh 60 pounds to 160 pounds to sell through the sale. No members may sell more than 3 lambs (depending on the number of exhibitors, there may be a limit of 2 per exhibitor).

- 8. Anyone using an artificial means to change the condition, form or shape of an animal will be disqualified from all classes in which they have entries at the discretion of the sheep show committee.
- 9. Time: Animals may be checked in from 6:00-8:00 P.M., Monday of fair week. Lambs may be removed Saturday, 6:00-7:00 A.M.
- 10. Each exhibitor is asked to fork out their pen before leaving. Clean-up is 7:00-10:00 A.M. Saturday. Health papers and premiums will be released after 10:00 a.m. provided exhibitor has cleaned up his/her pen(s). If an exhibitor is not present for clean-up he/she will forfeit premiums.







#### **Suggestions to Exhibitors**

- 1. Fruit butter is fruit which is cooked until soft. The pulp is then run through a sieve, making it quite smooth.
- 2. Honey spreads are fruit products which use honey in the preparation as a substitution for part of the sugar.
- 3. Jams are a thick, sweet spread with pieces of crushed or chopped fruit.
- 4. Preserves are like jams except the pieces of fruit are larger.
- Jellies are a clear, sweet spread made from fruit juice, pectin and sugar, which holds its shape when unmolded.
- Marmalades are clear, jellylike preserves made from pulp, juice, and rind of fruits. Ex: Citrus fruits.
